


Where does the name Valentine come from?

The holiday is aptly named after Saint Valentine, but who exactly was he? Valentine is likely based on a combination of two Valentines who were executed on February 14 in different years by Roman Emperor Claudius II in the 3rd century A.C.E., according to <u>NPR</u>. The Catholic Church maybe have established St. Valentine's Day to honor these two martyrs. Legend says that one of these men, Saint Valentine of Terni, had officiated weddings for Roman soldiers in secret, going against the emperor's wishes, making him seen to some as a proponent of love.

Another story involves the practice of writing love letters to your valentine. It's said that St. Valentine wrote the first "valentine" greeting to a young girl he tutored and fell in love with while he was imprisoned for the crimes outlined above. According to <u>The History Channel</u>, before his death, he wrote her a letter signed "From your Valentine," which remains a commonly used phrase to this day.

But these romantic anecdotes are only legends. So little historical information is known about the martyrs named St. Valentine that <u>in 1969</u> the Roman Catholic Church removed the feast day from its calendar, though St. Valentine is still recognized as a saint.

On hand for the ribbon-cutting ceremony were Aldermen for Ward 9 Rick Smith and Lee Shrake, wife of the MLA for Millican-Ogden, Gordon Shrake.

Construction of the 6500 sq ft building commenced in September 1989 and opened for use in March. Constructed on one-level the wheelchair accessible structure has a snooker and shuffleboard room, excellent wood working facility, a crafts shop, a lounge, kitchen and multipurpose activity room. The centre also operates recreational programs for seniors and has a health and outreach department, which serves over 30 clients.

The decision to get their own drop-in centre originated among members in the mid-eighties, said Harrison, when the club was operating in the Ogden School building which was inadequate for their needs. The club had been sharing the school for two days a week since the club was incorporated in 1975. Back then the club had between 30 - 40 members. The membership now stands at about 260 people.

The opening culminated many years of hard work and fundraising efforts of a membership determined to have it's own seniors citizens' centre.

"The members are excited and have every right to be proud", said club president Cliff Harrison of the \$600,000 structure.




FUN FACTS ABOUT FEB

- IF YOU WERE BORN IN FEBRUARY, YOUR BIRTHSTONE IS AN AMETHYST, AND YOUR FLOWER IS A PRIMROSE.






